Sub: Update in relation to Nurse Strike at Hospitals in Kerala

Ref: Disclosure under Regulation 30 read with Schedule III of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (“LODR Regulations”)

Pursuant to Regulation 30 of the LODR Regulations, read with SEBI Master Circular No. HO/49/14/14(7)2025-CFD-POD2/1/3762/2026 dated January 30, 2026, and in furtherance of our disclosure dated March 14, 2026 on this subject matter, we wish to inform you that we have been extensively engaging with the United Nurses Association over the last few weeks in order to arrive a settlement in relation to the nurses strike across hospitals in Kerala pertaining to their demands for revision in wage structures.

The Hon’ble High Court had directed the United Nurses Association to defer the strike and ensure that its members do not abstain from work or engage in any form of strike or obstruction until March 19, 2026, which was through several oral orders from the Hon’ble High Court has been extended till May 31, 2026. The proceedings continue to be pending with the Hon’ble High Court for a final settlement between the Kerala Private Hospital Association and United Nurses Association.

We wish to inform you that, in the interim, the entire nurse staff in the various Aster hospital units across Kerala, have returned to work and the operations have now resumed in full capacity at all such units.

The Company will continue to monitor developments closely and will keep the stock exchanges informed of any material updates.

7.	Details of steps taken to restore normalcy and the impact of the natural calamity/other force majeure events on production or service, financials of the entity.	The Company had activated internal contingency measures to ensure continuity of critical services and patient care across its facilities. It had also mobilized nurses from its other units across the neighboring states like Karnataka to ensure continuity of critical care. Kerala Private Hospital Association had also approached the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala at Ernakulam with a writ petition on this matter, which currently is sub-judice.
